

Fencing - **Hoop Top Fencing Style No 34 - Arnside**



Appearing in the Victorian and Edwardian era catalogues of both the William Cooper Company plus the Bayliss, Harding and Bayliss Company, this is perhaps both the classic and definitive style of hoop top, garden hurdles.

Providing decorative, stylish and robust bordering to areas of well planned landscaping, Lost Art Limited offer a high specification reproduction of the original items.

In contrast to much of the decorative ironwork of the Victorian period, this type of fencing was produced in wrought or 'worked' iron, rather than being cast from molten metal in moulds. Our authentic reworking of these items uses heavy gauge metal, which is shaped and assembled before being electroplated for a base corrosion protection before being powder coated to provide a tough external layer. These processes mean that the finished articles will enjoy both a long life and a low requirement for maintenance, making it ideal for installation in restored garden schemes or where the layout has been inspired by historic trends.

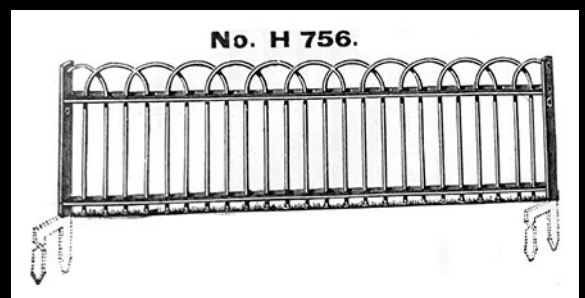
Please do not confuse these items with lightweight, low specification alternatives.
